















Tips to avoid being hacked and having your identity stolen.


NEVER

- Choose the same password for all your online accounts.
- Make up a password with your personal information (first name, date of birth, pet's name...).
- Share your passwords, even with a friend.

ALWAYS

 Create a strong password with a personalized secret code for each site. Strong means hard to guess. Your password can be based on a phrase you memorize and add numbers and special characters, like & or #.

Example: use the first letter of each word of a phrase you know by heart, like «It is so stupid to get hacked» and then add a symbol and a number, to get: «IiSsTgH&1ti». This is a very good password. You can personalize it further by adding the first two letters of the site where you are registering, that way you know it is only for that site.
